### **Sunday School Kids Create 78 School Kits**

Thank you so much to those who helped with our project to send school kits to Church World Service for distribution to kids in need. The project started when we were able to get a grant for \$250 from the national UCC Disaster Ministries to help with the shipping costs.

Two people who provided unique services were Doreen Richardson who provided much of the cloth for the bags and Pam Shelton who sewed all of the beautifully made cloth

bags in which we put the school supplies that many members of our church family contributed. Over 900 items were donated (even more if you count the 6 pencils per bag separately!). The older children were very helpful in assembling the kits at two different times in August and September. On October 5, we dedicated and blessed the kits during our World Communion Sunday worship service. The kits were sent to a CWS warehouse for use after a disaster here in the U.S. or overseas.

#### We Did It!

We recently completed the Raising Our Welcome capital campaign. Thanks to your



commitment and generosity, we met and exceeded our goal to raise \$400,000 for an elevator and other ADA improvements to our church building! At last report, we had
