The construction plans were submitted to the city in late July, and we have been working our way through the permit process in the intervening weeks. The review is in its final stages, and we are hopeful that permits will be issued in the next month. In anticipation of this approval, we are working with the contractor and architect to finalize pricing, review the construction schedule, and plan the logistics of the construction process.

Specifications for the elevator have been reviewed and approved, and it has been ordered. We are excited that we are nearing the starting line for the construction

phase of the project, and anticipate being able to share a ground breaking date with you shortly. The project oversight committee is Carl Wamser, Mike Van Loo, and Jon von Behren—we'll keep you updated as the project proceeds.

  - Your route leader is named at the top of your list. Please


call and inform your route leader soon after you have passed the stewardship album to the next person on the list. This lets your route leader know who has received the album. It's important to keep the album moving!

## Back to Eden and Community Garden Projects Growing

rossroads Community Garden volunteers are making significant progress in the development of the garden. Since the beginning of the year the site has been cleared and leveled; fence, concrete, and old lumber debris removed; base garden soil delivered and spread; and plot boundaries and walkways laid out. On October 5, the irrigation system will be installed!

None of this would have been possible without the labor of volunteers and funding help from benefactors. Along with Hillsdale Community Church, these benefactors also include Southwest Neighborhoods, Inc. (SWNI), OnPoint Credit Union, Friends of Portland Community Gardens, and most recently, West Multnomah Soil and Water Conservation District (WMSWCD).

West Multnomah Soil and Water Conservation District has also awarded a \$10,000 grant to the Crossroads Community Garden and Back to Eden projects. This is very exciting! The grant proposal focused largely on the Back to Eden project, which HCC has created and worked on for the past four years.

However, the job isn't finished. An important work party will take place on Saturday, October 10, starting at 12 noon. Tasks will include clearing of remaining gravel, debris, and weeds and spreading of additional planting soil onto the plots. The work party will be in conjunction with the citywide Parke Diem celebration sponsored by the Portland Parks Foundation. Volunteers should register at http://parklandia.org/content/crossroads-community-garden by October 5 at the latest. Participants will receive free event T-shirts, snacks, and other goodies from corporate sponsors.(If you don't register, you are still welcome, but the free prizes cannot be guaranteed.) The team hopes to have fun as well as accomplish much towards the goal of creating this much-needed neighborhood asset.
